

NOTICE TO MARINERS - No. 2 - 2017

ISPS REPORTING

In the interests of security, while operating within port limits, mariners are advised of the following:

1. Vessels Affected

The International Ship and Port Facility Security Code applies to all vessels over 500GT.

2. Failure to Comply

Failure to comply with the appropriate security standards will be in contravention of the Merchant Shipping Ship and Port Facility (Security) Regulations 2004, which may result in prosecution.

3. Reporting Requirements

All vessels over 500GT, which are SOLAS compliant, should complete the standard ISPS arrival proforma and return it to the relevant Port Facility Security Officer (PFSO) prior to port entry. (See www.cfpa.co.uk).

All other vessels and those claiming exemption, should complete a Declaration of Security (DOS) with the Port Facility Security Officer prior to port entry.

4. Vessels Alongside

The Ship Security Officer (SSO) should implement the necessary security precautions required as per the ship security plan and should at all times liaise and interface with the PFSO.

5. Ships Taking Stores and Spare Parts

Vessels taking stores and spare parts are required to notify the relevant PFSO prior to arrival of the goods at the quayside.
